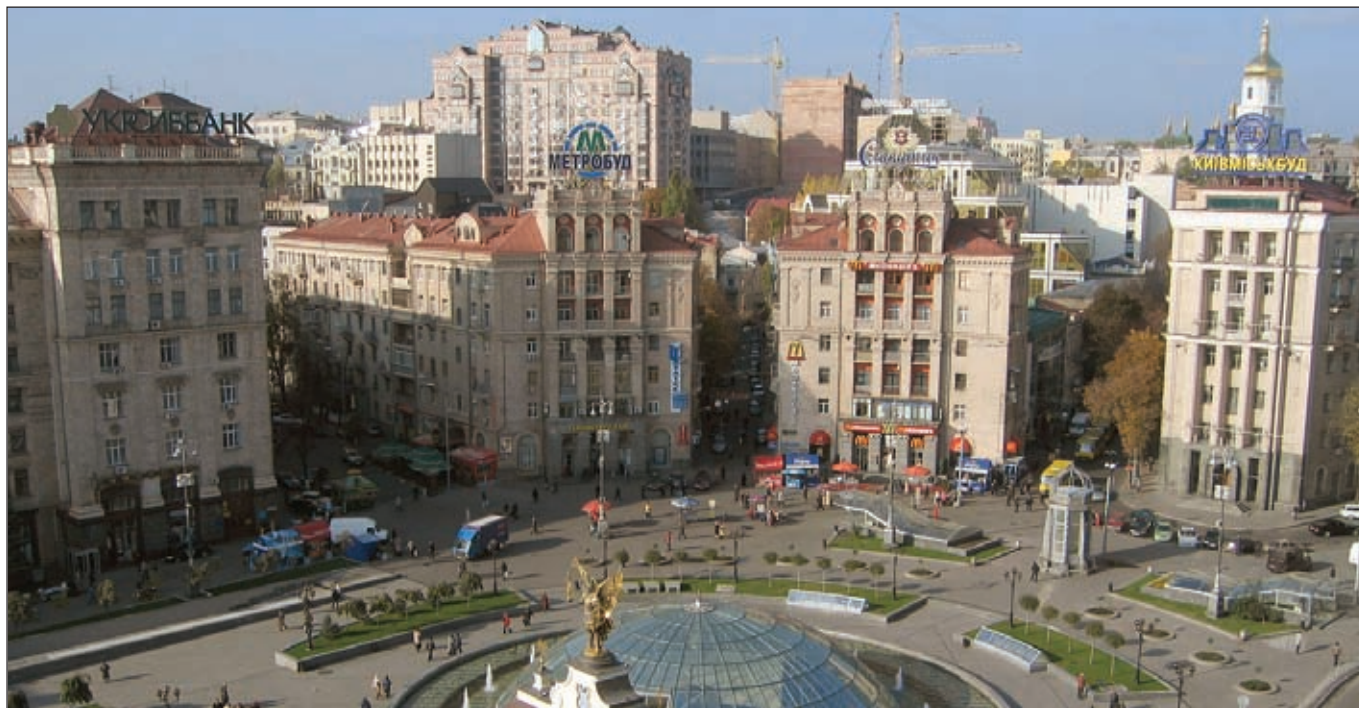

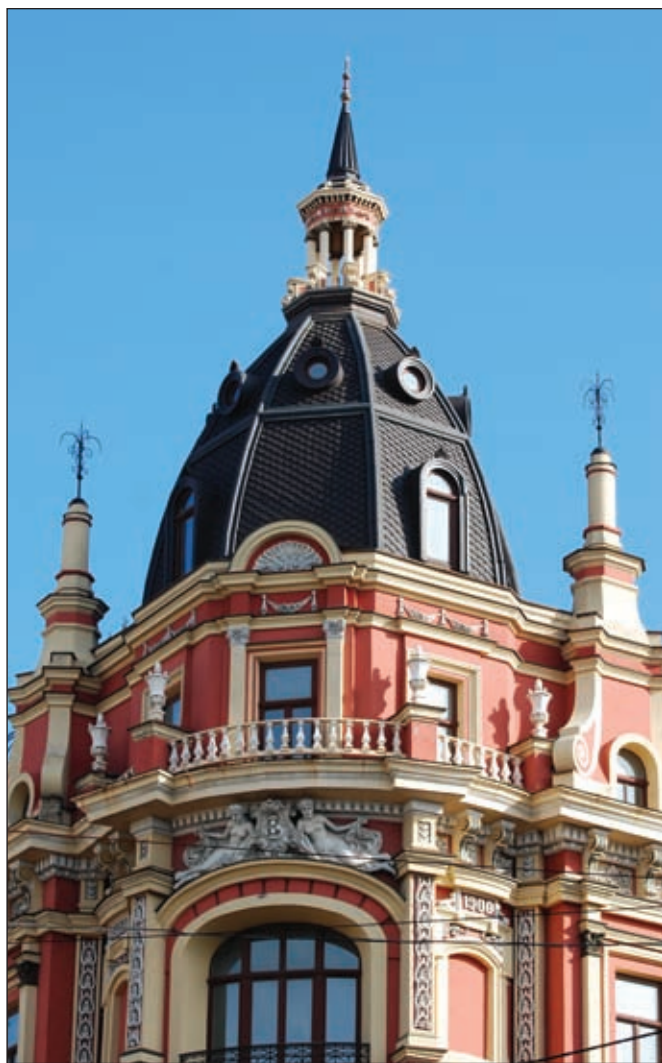
Technical Programme
